A total of 8 courses over the entire year, with no more than 4 courses at a time. Each period is 75 min long. Lunch is 65 minutes.






How is High School the same as Grade 8?


Barrie North...What Is It Like?

DIPLOMA REQUIREMENTS

Every year in Grade 9,10,11, you take 8 different courses. (In Grade 12, only 6 courses. You get a spare each semester!)

Each course = 1 credit (usually)

30 credits (2 Online Courses*) + 40 Hours of Community Service + 1 OSSLT (EQAO) = 1 High School Diploma!

19 of these credits are "compulsory" – you have to take them.

11 of these credits are "electives" – get to choose!

Online Course Requirement

*All students are required to complete TWO online learning credits as part of their OSSD.

Students can be exempt from this requirement by having their parent/guardian complete the opt out form provided by the school board.



40 Community Service Hours

You need to get 40 hours of community service before you can graduate high school.

You can start as soon as you graduate from grade 8!
Keep a record – signed by a supervisor.

Usually linked to a charity or "non-profit" organization

If you can do some hours this summer – DO IT!




OSSLT & EQAO

In Grade 9, you will do an EQAO math assessment like you have in Grades 3 and 6. Your Math teacher will prepare you and you write it in Math class.

The Ontario Secondary School Literacy Test is completed by Grade 10 students.

Students are prepared for the test throughout their Grade 9 and 10 years.



March 1st is the course selection deadline.


